## “Dr. Thelma B. Thompson Inducted Into the African American Golfers Hall of Fame”

Princess Anne, MD. (June 14, 2011) – “Golf is an \$80 billion-per-year industry.” Thelma B. Thompson, Ph.D. – “AAGHOF Inaugural University President of the Year” - once said, “In our culture, golf is not only an important recreational activity; it is also where a great deal of business networking occurs.

As the 13<sup>th</sup> University of Maryland Eastern Shore President, she believed that her students could benefit from understanding both.” Indeed, she is a *cum laude* graduate of Howard University, Washington, DC and holds the B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. degrees from that institution. At Howard, she was elected to the Phi Beta Kappa National Honor Society and received the coveted Terminal Fellowship Award. In addition, Dr. Thompson holds a diploma from Bethlehem College in Jamaica, and a certificate from London University.

She is considered to be an expert in accountability and accreditations, and has demonstrated leadership excellence in her present position. At UMES, Dr. Thompson has led the charge to assess student learning. Over 20 programs have received initial accreditation because of her emphasis on quality. Dr. Thompson lives by the “Golden Rule” and believes in character education that equips people for a life based in universally respected values. She is an optimist, a pragmatist, and an individual who has a deep conviction in the human potential for good.

The PGA Golf Management University Program, created in 1975 at Ferris State University, Big Rapids, Mich., as the first university to gain PGA accreditation and offer the PGM curriculum was brought to her attention. With the support of her staff, Dr. Thompson set her sites on UMES offering the program. The application process began in 2003 to satisfy the State of Maryland and the PGA of America. In January 2008, with great pride, the University of Maryland Eastern Shore in the quaint town of Princess Anne became the first historically black college accredited by the PGA of America to offer the PGA Golf Management University Degree Program to its students. The entire “UMES PGM Program” was inducted into the AAGHOF in 2010. Its first class is set to graduate in December 2012.

The “PGM Program” is a 4½-year structured college curriculum for aspiring PGA Professionals. The educational program is accredited by the PGA of America and includes extensive classroom studies, internship experience and player development providing students the opportunity to acquire knowledge and skills necessary to succeed in the golf industry. “Adding the PGA Golf Management University Program as part of the curriculum was the vision of UMES President, Dr. Thelma B. Thompson,” said Dr. Ernest P. Boger, Director, UMES Department of Hotel & Restaurant Management who provides its overall supervision because it naturally integrates all of its curriculum requirements with the knowledge base of the PGA Golf Management Program including sixteen months of structured internship experience and a Playing Ability Test (PAT).

“Dr. Thompson understands conducting business and playing golf go together,” said William ‘Billy’ Dillon, PGA, Director of the UMES PGA Golf Management University Program. “She wants all UMES students to have a chance to learn the basics of the game so when they are in the business world they won’t feel intimidated if offered a chance to play in a local charity fundraiser or invited to participate in a company retreat.”
